7. Explain the significance of the forest in the Sukumaran's early education. 2
8. How is Rama portrayed in Dhanya Vengachery's poem "Ramayanam"? 2

9. How does Shakespeare use the structure of "Sonnet 18" to build towards the theme of immortality through poetry? Identify specific lines or shifts in tone that contribute to this progression. 6
10. How does the traveller's role help explain the poem's themes? 6
11. Compare the societal critique in the poem "Where the Mind" by Ayyappa Paniker with the vision of an ideal society. What does this contrast reveal about the poet's aspirations and disappointments? 6
12. Discuss the theme of loss and grief in the poem "The Last Toast" by Anna Akhmatova. 6
13. Explore the role of imagination in the poem, "Poem I". How does the ability to create "places that do not exist" contrast with the challenges faced by the speaker in the physical world? 6
